Inspection Data Summary Report (IDSR)

The IDSR is the only bit of data that Ofsted get to see before they speak to Headteachers on the day before inspections. It's a broad snapshot of the school.

We probably don't show off enough about our attainment and progress because we know as a non-selective one form entry school that can change according to the needs of every class. Some years attainment will be lower but progress is very high because the class find learning harder.

Children are now only (formally and reported) assessed in Y1 (Phonics) and Y6 (Reading, Grammar and Maths tests and writing teacher assessment).

Here are last year's headlines from the IDSR:

Y1 Phonics at expected standard: In top 13% of England;

Y6 Reading at expected standard (or better): In top 13% of England;

Y6 Reading at higher standards; in top 11% of England;

Y6 Grammar Punctuation and Spelling at expected standard (or better): In top 11% of England;

Y6 Grammar Punctuation and Spelling at higher standard: In top 3% of England;

Y6 Writing at expected standard (or better): In top 21% of England:

Y6 Writing at higher standard: In top 4% of England;

Y6 Maths at expected standard (or better): In top 30% of England.

Y6 Maths at higher standard: In top 15% of England.

Y6 Reading, writing and maths at expected standard (or better): In top 13% of England.

This week in class

Nursery

Rob, wash, cut and blow dry? Head over to Nursery to make your appointment! This week Nursery have enjoyed role-playing hairdressers. Continuing with our 'All about me' topic, we read 'Mega magic hair swap' which inspired us to become hairdressers. We celebrated our different hair types and colour. Nursery met Jamal this week, who brings things in his basket (Hey Jamal fantastic, what's in your basket?). This week he brought objects that rhyme, as well as 2d shapes. This week was Axel, Lui and Naomi's focus week. Axel wanted to learn about dinosaurs- we've had a fun-filled dinosaur week, as well as playing with Numberblocks. Lui was keen to learn about space. We read 'Look up' and then watched a Time-lapse video of a meteor shower. We also read Big people, Little dreams 'Mae Jemison' and learnt all about her journey to become an astronaut. Naomi wanted to dress up (yeay- we love dressing up in Nursery), so we of course had a dress up party! Zig Zag is going home for the weekend with Matteo R.

Reception

In Reception this week we have been learning the sounds 'e', 'u', 'r' and our first digraph 'ck'. This is 'two letters that makes one sounds'. We also learnt our first tricky word 'is'. We discovered that the 's' is the tricky part as it sounds like a 'z'. In maths we have been doing patterns- recognising them, continuing them and even creating our own. After learning about the inventor of the traffic lights 'Garrett Morgan', we created patterns using only the traffic light colours. We have been preparing and getting ready for our Heath trip on Monday by discussing Autumn. We did a lovely Autumn yoga story where we did lots of different animal poses of those that hibernate and those that migrate. Finally we met Pantosuarus who reminds us that our privates are privates, and that we should say no if someone asks to see them. Class 1

This week in literacy we have been doing some lovely writing all about the story of 'Giraffes Can't Dance'. The children have learnt to use the conjunction 'and' and some lovely adjectives within their written work to make their writing more detailed. They have also started using red pen once they have finished their work to make alterations and correct any errors within their work. In maths we have started addition to 10. We have been looking at parts and whole and the children can now write some addition number sentences using the part-whole model. In history we have learnt about the significant figure of Ruby Bridges. We had some fantastic conversations regarding difference and that we should all respect each other and never judge someone by the colour of their skin. In D&T today we made some savoury and sweet scones and had a lovely afternoon tea in class. Thank you to the parents who sent in food items etc. Have a gorgeous weekend everyone!

Class 2

This week in Class 2, we have been learning how to add 2 and 3 digit numbers together. We discovered that finding pairs that make 10 was the easiest way to do this. In literacy, we have been learning about how the Great Fire of London spread. We will add this writing to our information books next week. In RE, we learnt about the parable of the wise and foolish builders and how Christians believe that God is their 'rock.' We enjoyed being able to give back to our local community during Harvest Festival this morning.

Class 3

A very busy week for Class 3, with cross country and our school trip to The Place adding onto our activities. I have to first acknowledge how wonderful our students were on our first trip using the tube. We had a few nervous students, but they did an amazing job listening, being respectful and making safe choices. It was a joy to see students in such a fun and creative space. In the classroom, we have been working hard at improving our times tables facts and moving towards knowledge of our 3's, 4's and 6's. We urge students to practice daily, even if its just for 5 minutes, I promise it will have an impact! One week to go, before a well deserved break for my hard working class.

Class 4

Our week began with learning to subtract four-digit numbers using the column method. We did this with no exchange, then with one exchange, and will move onto more than one exchange next week. In literacy, we focused on the skills of proofreading and editing our own work, as well as other pieces of writing. These are skills we will continue to develop going forward. In history, we examined different sources of evidence of the discovery of the ancient Egyptian Pharaoh, Tutankhamun, using what we found to then write a newspaper report detailing this discovery. We also had a wonderful trip to Argyll Primary school and were able to take part in a dragon draw-along with Harry Potter illustrator, Jonny Duddle. We absolutely loved it!

Class 5

This week, Class 5 has been learning in Maths about common multiples of 2 numbers and factors, while in Literacy we learned about adverbials and their function. We also read a new narrative poem, which is also a cautionary tale, and analysed the literary techniques used. Class 5 compared in Science the life cycles of plants, mammals, amphibian and birds, while in PSHE, we understood and interpreted the information on different food labels.

Class 6

After a soggy Monday morning start, year 6 managed to complete their visit to London Zoo as part of our Science work on Evolution and Inheritance. A big thank-you to all parents who helped out. In Maths, we reviewed double-digit multiplication and both short & long division - the latter of which proved very tricky. In Literacy, we were introduced to the bard - William Shakespeare and the children researched a little of his life and we also read the story of Romeo and Juliet. On Thursday, we were lucky enough to participate in a live webinar from Concordia research station in Antarctica. The children were guided by Dr. Jessica Studer who told us all about the harsh conditions living on 'White Mars'. Thanks to Dawn who also taught the children some 'wartime' cookery and creating recipes with limited ingredients: the children cooked up some rather marvellous corned-beef fritters - and scoffed the lot! Our class assembly is next Friday, 25th October.


