As the vast majority of social events are open to extended family and friends and often ex-Fitzjohn's people as well as neighbours then the gates are left open to allow access and egress.




Attendance

This week in class

Nursery

This week we read 'Pete the cat and his four groovy buttons'. The story linked to our number of the week, four. We've used a range of resources to support our understanding of number bonds, such as Numicon and multilink cubes. In phonics we learnt the phoneme /p/. We discovered the following words all start with the same sound; pink, pencil, penguin, pumpkin, pineapple, pizza and peppa pig! This week it was Ari, Jagoda and Michaela's focus week. Ari loves Owls so we revisited the story 'Owl babies' and learnt some

Interesting facts about owls. Did you know, an owl has different sized ears and three eye lids?! We created a sea world full of sharks for Michaela, as well as reading shark in the park. To support Jagoda's interest in art, we had an art and craft day today. We've thoroughly enjoyed singing our new weekly rhyme, 5 current buns. We made current buns with salt dough and the children have played independently singing the song, whilst gaining an understanding of take-away.

Reception

Reception have done really well this week learning three new sounds. They learnt the final letter of the alphabet 'z', and then two digraphs 'qu' and 'ch'. Our new tricky words were 'go' and 'no'. The children are doing really well at writing simple CVC words. We have continued with our Naughty Bus book- painting our wooden buses we made, drwing our own buses, and learning prepositions as he travels all over the classroom. In maths we have been working on the numbers 4 and 5. We are looking at the numbers they are made up of, and trying to subitise so we don't always count! We finished the week doing a vehicle tally of how many vehicles we saw from the school gate- lots of cars and bikes, but quite a few buses too! We don't think they were Naughty!

Class 1

This week in literacy the children have started creating their own version of the story 'Lost in the Toy Museum'. They have planned out their stories and designed a front cover ready to write next week. In maths we have focused on writing eight number sentence fact families. In science we looked at toys and discussed their materials and their properties. In art we drew and coloured a rocking horse . In topic we have started creating our toy shop and have started learning about how toys have changed over the years.

Class 2

This week in Class 2, we have written a newspaper report about a true British hero, Mary Seacole. The children enjoyed writing about her life and tremendous achievements. They used presentational devices such as headlines, paragraphs, expanded noun phrases and facts about the main event, to create eye-catching articles. In maths, we learnt how to use the column method to add two two-digit numbers, which many of us have found to be easier than other methods! The children have done a great job of learning their lines for the Nativity, which we began to rehearse today. Please help them to memorise them over the weekend. Thank you so much to the parents who have been able to help us with props and scenery. Just a reminder that we will be going to Keats Library on Tuesday, so please make sure books are returned by Tuesday morning in order for new ones to be borrowed. A second reminder to bring in costumes by Wednesday at the latest (in a named bag) Thank you.

Class 3

This week in Class 3, we completed our maths unit on addition and subtraction, tackling multi-step word problems, as well as using inverse operation and estimation to check our answers carefully. Our next unit will be on multiplication and division, starting on Monday. In literacy, we used our studies of the legend of St. George to plan exciting words for a character description. We used a thesaurus to widen our vocabulary too. In our big write, and then composed a detailed character description of either the dragon or George for our Big Write – we chose which character we preferred. We included details of appearance, personality, and how they were feeling too. In science, we conducted an experiment to see which materials reflected the most light, making a prediction and recording the results carefully. Next week, we'll be writing our class assembly together ready for the 13th December.

Class 4

This week in maths, we started our multiplication and division topic. We have been working on multiplying and dividing by 4, 6 and 9. We have been learning to use strategies such as repeated addition for multiplication, as well as sharing and grouping for division. Not only that, but we have also been learning different 'tips and tricks' to help build up our fluency in our multiplication and division facts. In literacy, we have moved onto learning about persuasive letter writing. We identified the features of these and ordered and labelled a persuasive letter. We also explored different persuasive techniques such as exaggeration, flattery and the use of emotive language. In history, we examined pictures of different ancient Egyptian artefacts, drew our own illustrations of these. We also described and posed questions about them. In science, we planned our evaporation investigation, which we will carry out next week.

Class 5

Class 5 has been learning in Maths how to add and subtract fractions and mixed numbers, while in Literacy we've started reading A Christmas Carol, characterizing Scrooge. In Science, we learned about thermal conductos and insulators, and in Geography we looked into the different features of Physical and Human Geography. Class 5 has also been spending a lot of time rehearsing of our assembly, coming up together with lines for the script and making our props in Art.

Class 6

Would you know how to define a fraction? Class 6 have dipped their toes into equivalent fractions, fractions on a number line and they have used this knowledge to begin to compare and order fractions - by manipulating denominators. Our Literacy biographies have finally been penned, checked, edited and improved. In our History topic, we had an interesting discussion around the concept of propaganda - an issue as relevant today as it was during the height of WW2. Our lessons in P.S.H.E and R.E. saw us learn about medicinal drugs and their responsible use and what religions teach us about 'life after death': some really interesting points were raised I can tell you! Finally, in Art we began the construction of a wooden base, using the skills of measuring, cutting and gluing bits of wood to create a stable, box frame and in Science we researched and shared work on both good and bad microbes.


