This week in class		
Nursery	Happy new year! It's wonderful to be back. The children have been excited to play with their friends and settle back into Nursery life! Our topic this term is 'Meet the characters', where we'll be exploring a range of Julia Donaldson stories. We began our topic with the story 'Tiddler'. We're exploring ocean life and have many activities in class relating to 'under the sea'. The children have been busy creating their own Tiddler tales and they've been uploaded to Tapestry. This week's rhyme 'I can build a snowman' was very fitting. If only we had more snow to actually build a snowman! Zig Zig is off for an adventure with Ellie C this weekend.	
Recep- tion	Reception have had a great start to 2025! We have learnt three new digraphs this week and one trigraph. Can they tell you what a trigraph is? We learnt ai as in rain, ee as in sheep, igh as in light and oa as in soap. Lots of our activities this week have been based around these sounds. We had a police role play with a jail, made some cute cotton wool sheep, investigated light and started Friday with some buttered yummy toast! Our challenge on Friday was to design and make a boat that floats out of junk modelling. Some were more successful than others! Our new tricky words all rhyme this week- we, me and be. We also did lots of recap over the last terms tricky words, learning to read and write the tricky words. In maths we have been learning about zero, what it means and what it looks like!	
Class 1	This week in literacy we have been doing reading assessments which tested the children's decoding and comprehensions skills. In maths we have also been doing arithmetic, reasoning and problem-solving assessments. The children all tried their best and produced some great results. In literacy we have also looked at story mountains and how to structure a story. The children then had a go at writing a story from a picture and included an opening, build up, problem, resolution and closing. In maths we have started looking at and sorting 2D and 3D shapes. In PSHE we looked at different ways of looking after ourselves and in Art the children made some moving cup toys. Well done for a great week back Year 1!	
Class 2	Welcome back and happy new year! It has been a busy but lovely first few days back in Class 2. The children have come back revitalised and enthusiastic, throwing themselves into our topic about 'Whales.' We have spent this short week learning all about Blue Whales. The children wrote information reports about them yesterday, having researched them for the previous couple of days. We will be displaying some of these in class over the next few days. In maths, we have started a unit on 'Shape.' The children have learnt the word 'vertices' to describe what we might call the 'corners' of a shape (where two edges meet) We are looking forward to seeing you on Tuesday morning for our first Magical Maths Morning of 2025. Don't forget that we are going to Keats Library on Wednesday next week, rather than Tuesday. All Keats books must be back at school by Wednesday morning at the latest, so that new books can be borrowed. Thank you and have a lovely weekend.	
Class 3	Class 3 got off to a fantastic start this week. We focused on equal grouping in maths, exploring the relationship between multiplication and division. We then applied our knowledge to solving related problems. In literacy, we used our creative talents and teamwork to write a class poem which used repetition, and descriptive words and phrases drawing on all 5 senses as well as on memories. In guided reading, we focused on recognising the skills needed to answer questions about a text correctly and thoroughly. We practised summarising, predicting, inferring (or 'reading between the lines') and scanning for key words from the question. Our new topic in history this term is Iron Age Celts in Britain. Again, using teamwork skills, we worked in groups to create a prehistoric timeline using BC (BCE) and AD (CE). In computing, we had a quiz to see whether using an image or text is more effective, ready for our desktop publishing project. Finally, in PSHE, we all made some New Year's resolutions, and discussed how we would achieve our goals to become even more EXCELLENT!	
Class 4	Our first week back has been a busy and productive one. In maths, we have been learning how to identify and use factor pairs as well as how to multiply by 10 and 100 using place value to help us. In literacy, we started to read our new class novel, "Iron Man". We have been clarifying the meaning of words, learning about personification, onomatopoeia, illustrating a main character and using expanded noun phrases and similes to describe him as well as using direct speech to retell some other characters' experiences so far in the book. We also started our swimming lessons this week and have been really enjoying these and are already making lots of progress!	
Class 5	Class 5 has had a great start to the new year! We've been learning in Maths how to do long multiplication using different methods, while in Literacy we've been analysing the short film The girl and the Fox as part of our topic - Let's go to the Movies. We've focused on re-telling and summarizing the film, discussing its meaning and using 'Show not Tell' to make our writing more interesting. In History, Class 5 made brochures on Hampstead, which is this half term's History topic, presenting some key facts on the area. Class 5 also learned in PSHE about the signs of mild and severe head injuries and incidents when a casualty is unresponsive, discussing what we should do in such an occurrence. We've also been joined by Ben, the trainee teacher doing his placement in Class 5, which has been great.	
Class 6	After learning about how Kipling creates tension, the children moved onto his 'Just So' stories which are an entirely different, humorous kettle of fish - so to speak. The class learned how he used repetition, word play and devices such as onomatopoeia and alliteration to create fun and interesting stories that were meant to entertain young children. In maths, we are finishing our fraction topic by learning how to multiply fractions and in Art (with Dawn), the children learned the skills of blending watercolour paints to create a piece of art based on the works of Georgia O' Keeffe. In our new Crime & Punishment topic, we started a discussion on 'Why do societies punish?' and in R.E we learned about the fundamental concepts of 'Humanism'. Next week, we have a trip to the CLC on Tuesday 14th January.


