This week in class	
Nursery	<p>This week we've been inspired by the Russian artist, Wassily Kandinsky. We created art using various shapes and concentric circles. They're on display in class, please do come and have a look!</p> <p>We've put our phonetic awareness to good use and we've been orally segmenting and blending words this week. In maths we've been using our knowledge of numbers to 5 in various 'take away' activities. We also read 'Part of the party' and during a circle time we spoke about our families and what we enjoy doing with them. What makes a family? Kindness, respect, Love and so much more! It been a glorious sunny week and we've made the most of playing and exploring in the playground! The children have enjoyed finding mini-beasts in the garden area, experimenting in the water area and cooking in the mud kitchen- petal soup...yummy! As well as painting in the sunshine and playing games with friends.</p>
Reception	<p>This week in Reception we have been doing lots of maths work. We are checking that we know all our numbers up to 20. Can they remember how many tens it has. We then starting spotting patterns in numbers beyond 20. We were introduced to the hundred square and enjoyed colouring the patterns we could see.. In drawing club we have enjoyed reading the book Chicken Licken, even though it has quite a shocking ending. We designed our own sky, and then drew a trap to catch the fox if he tried to come to school! In phonics we have been reading very long words, up to 6 sounds. We had a go at writing scrunch and sprint. Our new tricky words were little, were and do.</p>
Class 1	<p>This week in phonics the children have been recapping all phase 5 sounds ready for the phonics screening check in June. We have read, written and played games at https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/ to remind us about the important phonemes we need to know. In maths we have learnt all about positional and directional vocabulary. This was particularly useful for our treasure hunt on Wednesday. The children had to use their maps of the school and this vocabulary to direct their partners to the buried treasure. The children wore their explorer hats and treasure bags and had lots of fun! On Tuesday we went on a school trip to Golders Hill park to do a mapping workshop in the rose garden. The children listened beautifully and thoroughly enjoyed exploring the park. In PSHE we looked back and discussed our achievements in Year 1 and in D&T we have done lots of cooking in preparation for our picnic. Today we had our Winnie the Pooh themed picnic on the lawn. Thank you to everyone who came, donated money, brought items, help set up etc. What an action packed and fun week - well done Year 1!</p>
Class 2	<p>In Class 2 this week, we have been learning to use possessive apostrophes. The children have grasped the concept well and have written some great sentences! We have made cave painting drawings and beautiful scientific sketches of the inside of a bulb, which we're looking forward to showing you at our assembly next Friday. We also have our trip to Kew Gardens next Wednesday 15th May. The children will need a packed lunch and snack, as well as a water bottle and waterproof coat. Thank you</p>
Class 3	<p>We have been working hard practising our lines and songs for our assembly. The rehearsals went well and the show itself went even better. The children showed dedication, courage and resilience in learning their lines and lyrics and made themselves extremely proud. We also started our legend sequel to Beowulf, which we have been applying our learning of 'show, not tell' to develop our characters, using the senses to add description to our settings and aiming to include a variety of sentence openers and expanded noun phrases throughout. We learned to partition the whole in our Maths fractions topic and discovering that any fraction which has the same denominator and numerator is equal to one whole.</p>
Class 4	<p>Year 4 have had a brilliant week. In Literacy, we have been generating powerful vocabulary and poetic devices for our free verse poetry. We have been planning our own poetry and writing our own. In Maths, we have learnt how to convert hundredths between fractions and decimals. In RE, we have been learning how Buddha's revelations influence Buddhists' daily lives. We have also been learning about food rituals across different religions. In DT, with Rob's help, we enjoyed finishing our electronic quizzes. We created wooden frames for our colourful games to sit on and hid the electric cabling behind it. Then, we attached the buzzer or the bulb and the battery!</p>
Class 5	<p>This week, Class 5 learned in Maths how to translate coordinates, draw lines of symmetry, reflect shapes in horizontal and vertical lines as well as add decimals. In Literacy, we continued reading The Invention of Hugo Cabret, analysing the next chapter as well as planning and writing a newspaper report based on the book. In Geography, Class 5 compared the physical features of the Peak District with the Death Valley in the US. Lastly, in PSHE we spoke about the sense of belonging we feel in places outside of school and in RE we researched information about Hajj.</p>
Class 6	<p>Congratulations Class 6: you have all shown tremendous resilience in the last four quite intense weeks of learning. I am proud of you all and I wish you the best of luck in next week's SATs tests - you'll be fab! Breakfast is served from 8:30am. In Geography, we have begun the process of comparing and contrasting Whitby with London. The children have researched the abbey, Scarborough castle and they have debated the differences of living in a seaside town.</p>
