SAVE THE DATE!

	This week in class
Nursery	We started the week with a trip to West Hampstead Fire station. The children met the 'blue watch' team and enjoyed sitting on the fire engine, as well as using the hose! We used the bus for first time and we were so incredibly proud of how sensible the children were. We've read many stories about fire fighting, 'Dinosaur firefighters' was a favourite. We were inspired to create a display. The children have been busy painting dinosaurs and making fire engines using egg boxes (thank you to Rae for eating so many eggs!!). In maths we've focused on shape. We're much more confident with naming a pentagon and hexagon! We've also been learning how many sides are on a shape. We're excited about sports day next week, look out on GC for the team list. We'll be focusing on the 'Police' next week, we may even have some Police officers visiting on Wednesday!
Recep- tion	Receptions caterpillars are growing and growingwe think they might build a cocoon soon. We have enjoyed continuing to learn about minibeasts this week- we have learnt some poems ready for our assembly next week and read lots of minibeast stories. We learnt that butterflies are symmetrical, and created our own symmetrical butterflies. In phonics we have been reading and writing CVCC and CCVC words with digraphs, e.g. toast, green. In maths we have been investigating tricky concepts of odds, evens and doubling. Can they tell you any doubles? On Sunday it is Fathers Day so we made cards, and shared lots of reasons we love our Daddies!
Class 1	This week in literacy the children have been writing their postcards to Rob all about their adventure around London. They remembered to include an address, a greeting, a message and a conclusion. They also drew a lovely picture on the front of their postcard. In maths we have been working on comparing numbers to 100. We have written number sentences with the greater than, less than and equals symbols in. In art we have created beautiful rainbow tree paintings ready to display in our classroom. This week the children also did their phonics screening test. We are all so proud of how hard they worked and their results are amazing!! Have a great weekend Class 1.
Class 2	Class 2 have been wonderful this week, demonstrating resilience and a great 'have a go' attitude towards some little tests that we did. They continue to amaze me with their wit and intelligence and I am very proud of them! Despite my absence, we packed in quite a bit of learning about Stonehenge and continued with guided reading and spelling. Next week, we will be back to normal business and tackling statistics in maths and some imaginative story writing.
Class 3	Our week started with sports day which we had a fantastic day filled with fun, challenge and exercise. We're all extremely proud of our efforts. In Maths, we have been continuing with our Time topic. We learned how to read and write minutes past the hour then to the hour on analogue clocks. We then learned to read and write the time in digital and learned to use AM and PM when telling the time. In literacy, we read the narrative poem, 'Hansel and Gretel' by Roald Dahl and started by identifying the poetry features we learned last week such as alliteration, similes, rhyme, humour etc. We then created storyboards to illustrate what happened in the poem including the setting, characters and events. In Geography, we learned more about volcanoes and created diagrams to help explain how they are formed. In computing, we have identified and explored additional features in our Scratch projects and building more sequences of commands to make them work better.
Class 4	What a super week! In Literacy, we have been creating persuasive campaigns to Save The Rainforest! We have made posters with a range of persuasive techniques, rhetorical questions, powerful imagery and emotive language. In Maths, we have finished our unit on time, where we learnt to tell the time on an analogue clock and convert to and from 12 and 24 hour digital time. In Art, we created beautiful panoramic rainforest scenes, inspired by French artist, Henri Rousseau. We have also spent lots of time revising our times tables and successfully sat our Multiplication Table Check!
Class 5	This week, Class 5 have been learning about negative numbers in Maths, while in Literacy we finished reading The Highwayman. We analysed the literary techniques and we planned and wrote a newspaper report on the events of the narrative poem. In Science/P.S.H.E., we learned about the different changes boys' and girls' bodies undergo during puberty, while in RE we discussed Christian rituals.
Class 6	After a hectic, cold and competitive sports day, Year 6 have been engaging with a lovely short film called 'The Girl and the Fox'. They are creating a narrative description that showcases their talents and writing skills from KS2. We have also created our business teams and the children are busily thinking about their products (or services) together with their business name, corporate logo and slogans. The aim is to 'pitch for a loan' (from the bank of Pete) to put their entrepreneurial ideas into reality so that they can sell for profit at the upcoming summer fair. Rehearsals for 'The Switch' are now also in full swing: please get your children learning their lines at home. Don't forget that the Year 6 Geography project should also be being completed as homework: the deadline day for submission is July 10th.
