	This week in class				
Nursery	A police carin Fitzjohn's? Yes, you heard right! No need to worry, the Police were visiting Nursery as part of our 'people who help us' topic. We're leaning so much about the emergency services. The police officers kindly let us try on their police hats, as well as showing us how to use their radios to talk to each other. We're thoroughly enjoying our topic and hopefully inspiring the children to dream big! Next week we'll be learning about doctors, nurses and paramedics. We were very excited for our first sports day. The children did so well competing in their races, it was so much fun! We've started rehearsing for our assembly next week, the children can't wait to share our new songs and a special video. Enjoy the sunny weekend!				
Reception	Reception did fantastically in their assembly today. We had only been working on it since Monday, but they remembered all their lines and their acting! Great singing and poetry reciting too! This week we have continued to watch our caterpillars in class, 4 out of the 5 have now made a cacoon. We have been reading the Hungry Caterpillar this week, each day having the different fruit in our role play and helping us remember the days of the week. In phonics we have learnt our last tricky words- 'out' and 'today'. In Maths we have been using our mathematical language to talk about positions, and shape properties. It was a bit tricky at first! Finally the children showed excellent determination and stamina in Sports Day on Thursday. There was great balancing, running, throwing and dribbling!				
Class 1	This week in literacy we have been learning about plurals, prefixes and suffixes. We learnt the rules of them and wrote some lovely sentences. In maths we have started learning about money and recognising coins and notes and their value. On Tuesday we went to Camley street and did some great workshops about minibeasts and plants. On Friday Lyova's mum joined us and did lots of activities about how to look after a planet. Thank you very much Diana! Have a lovely weekend Year 1.				
Class 2	In Class 2 this week, we started to look at statistics, which usually tends to involve ice cream! Class 2 have excelled in this area and are manipulating data with aplomb. We will move onto pictograms in the next few sessions. In literacy, we have written the introduction to a story called 'The Black Hat' which is about a boy who finds more than he imagined on a forest walk one day. We practised using adjectives, verbs and adverbs, trying to squeeze as much detail into our introductions as possible. Next week, we will work on the 'build-up' of the story and the ending. We are excited about our Camden Schools Music Cluster Festival next Thursday and have been practising!				
Class 3	We have been continuing our learning of time in Maths. We have been learning about years, months and days which included learning more about leap years as well as solving problems related to all of these. We learned about days and hours and solving problems involving calculating how many hours are in a given number of days using the partitioning method. We moved onto learning about hours and minutes and solving problems involving start and end times. We then moved onto solving problems relating to durations. In literacy, we finished our storyboards and used these as well as a mind map of the narrative poem, "Hansel and Gretel", to begin to write our own narrative poem based on this poem. We have worked hard to include the features learned last week such as rhyme, alliteration and similes. In Science, we learned more about flowers through labelling these and identifying the important jobs they do and how these relate to pollination and fertilisation. In Geography, we explored more about volcanoes and debating the possible reasons for and against living deciding to live near these. In computing, we have learning to identify and fix bugs in projects using Scratch.				
Class 4	Year 4 have worked hard this week. In Literacy we have enjoyed reading the Shaman's Apprentice. We learnt to analyse the author's use of language. In Maths, we have carried on with our learning on shape. We are able to identify different triangles and quadrilaterals and can describe their properties using mathematical language. In RE, we learnt about the Parable of The Good Samaritan. We broke this story up into 6 key events and drew them onto the net of a cube. In Geography we have being learning the layers of the rainforest. Our trip to London Zoo brought our learning alive. We had the best time!				
Class 5	Class 5 has been learning about converting units of measurement in Maths, such as ml, mm, m, units of length and time. In Literacy, we wrote our own narrative poems similar to The Highwayman. In Science, we made bar and line graphs to represent the average height of babies growing up, while in PSHE we spoke about the importance of hygiene during puberty. We also learned about the Mezuzah in RE and we had our Pedestrian skill training.				
Class 6	The CEO of the Year 6 'Our Business' project required changes to our teams: we reviewed the processes of mergers and acquisitions and children re-formed their business entities bringing them more in-line with modern-day business principles. It was assessment week and so that children completed their final tests and they also wrote an extended piece for a magazine article about 'An inspirational Person'. Thank-you to the class for officiating and helping so well with the ks1 sports day on Thursday - you were superstars. Finally, rehearsal have been going well - children just need to cement their lines and cues by next week please. Congratulations to our footballs - who competed so well in Coram's Fields on Friday - more details next week!




